Taxis

Allow 45 minutes for the trip from D/FW Airport to TCU.

Driving to TCU

TCU is located four miles southwest of downtown Fort Worth on University Drive.

From the D/FW Airport, follow the South airport exit. Take 360 South to Arlington. From 360 follow signs to I-30 West to Fort Worth. Travel through to Fort Worth (past Six Flags and the Ballpark). Travel through downtown and exit 12A University Drive South. TCU is 1.7 miles from the Interstate.

From the north or south, take I-35 West to I-30 West. Travel through downtown and exit 12A University Drive South. TCU is 1.7 miles from the Interstate.

From the west or east, take I-30 to exit 12A University Drive South. The campus is about 1.7 miles from the Interstate.

• Continuing south on **University**, approaching the top of the hill, *turn left at the light onto Cantey*. Moudy North, the building where we are meeting, will now be on your right. Pass Moudy, turn right onto Greene Ave. and right onto Princeton St.: the **parking entrance** will be on your right.

Parking: Parking in reserved lots behind Moudy is allowed on weekends. A walkway leads from the parking lot to a covered passage between Moudy North and South. The lobby area for Moudy North Room 141N is through the first door on the right.
